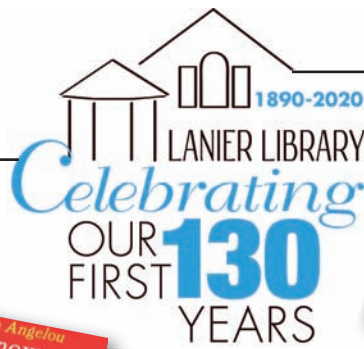


Great Books CHALLENGE
